DBG and his wife, Paula, were married in a civil ceremony in New York City.



DBG served as Israel's first Prime Minister. On Friday night, May 14th, 1948, on the eve of Shabbat, DBG declared the establishment of a Jewish state to be known as Israel.



DBG displayed a great aptitude for learning languages; in addition to speaking Yiddish-Hebrew, he also spoke Turkish, English, Russian, French, German, Spanish, and ancient Greek.
